Under 11 Minor (for players without an ECF rating or rated below 500 ECF and 800 on lichess)

Players are free to enter a higher section if they choose.

The organisers reserve the right to move a player from one section to another.

It will give you reduced entry fees to many tournaments, support English chess development and give you an excellent free monthly online chess magazine.

The highest placed student from Brentwood Prep in the U11 Open will become Prep School Champion. A play-off will decide if scores are tied.
